



# *Celebrating 50 Years at the heart of Thurles Community Part 2*

In 1990/91 season the schoolboys u14 team were T.S.S.D.L. league winners and were the u14 South-East Championship Winners over Johnsville of Waterford.

Peake Villa also travelled to Bradford in England with u16 and u15 Boys teams to play in the Bradford Cup. We returned successful as winners of both the u16 and u15 Bradford Invitational Cups.

In 1991/92 the u15 team were T.S.S.D.L. league winners and were the u15 South-East Championship Winners over Tramore of Waterford..

In 1995/96 season the Peake Villa youths team managed by Willie Mulcaire reached the Munster Youth Cup

semi-final only to loose to Casement Celtic of Cork. The squad included Vincent Coughlan, Derek Treacy, David Duggan, Frank Roche, Keith Phillips, John Walshe, Jason Kavanagh, Michael Butler, Emmet Maher, David Williams, Paul Egan, Padraig ODwyer, Wayne Keane, David Molumby, Ger O'Grady, Ollie Geoghegan and Joe Clare.

In 1996/97 Season the schoolboys won the u14 double by winning the T.S.S.D.L. u14 League and Cup. The squad was David Horan, Mark O'Dwyer, Eoin Costello, Aidan Dundon, Eoin Maher, Ted O'Connor, Robert Farrell, Clifford Kileen, Jamie Whelan, Donal Duggan, Martin J. O'Sullivan, Tony Ruth,

Conor Walshe, Padraic Fogarty, Michael Ryan and David Keane.

In 1997/98 Season the Junior B team were crowned the T.S.D.L. Division 3 League Winners. The squad was Emmet Maher, Shane Nolan, Andy Rossiter, Damien Kinane, Anthony Kirby, Eamonn Walsh, Seamus Woodlock, Liam O'Dwyer, Rory Philips, Willie Browne, Padraig O'Connor, John Walshe and Joe Clare. The Youths team were crowned the T.S.D.L. Youth Cup winners.

The schoolboys u15 won the double by capturing the T.S.S.D.L. u15 League and Cup. The squad was Aidan Dundon, Martin J. O'Sullivan, David Horan, Conor Walsh, Eoin Maher, Eoin Costello,

Donal Duggan, Tony Ruth, John Hussey, ted O'Connor, Padraic Fogarty and Lorcan Kelly. They also won the inaugural u15 Munster Cup and reached the SFAI National Cup 1/4 Final.

The u14 also completed the double by winning the League and Cup and they reached the last sixteen of the SFAI National Cup.

The u12 were league runners-up.

In 1998/99 Season the schoolboys won the u16 League and Cup to complete a remarkably three in a row T.S.S.D.L. Double of League and Cup winners, at u14, u15 and u16 for this squad.

In 1999/2000 the Junior team won the TSDL

Division 1 Shield cup. The squad was managed by Seamus Woodlock and John Walsh with players, Ted O'Connor, Michael Butler, Jonathan Connors, Derek Breen, John Lawlor, Trevor Connors, Willie Lawlor, Alan Kennedy, Shane Fogarty, John Walshe, Liam O'Dwyer, Michael Loughnane, Sam Walsh, Conor Walsh, P.J. Mooney, Tom Stakelum, Ger Butler, Damien O'Brien, Kieran O'Brien and N. Woodlock.

This was the season that marked the start of a rich batch of talent of players emerging from the Peake Villa schools section into the youths team. The lads at schoolboys had success in both TSSDL League and Cup in u14, u15 and u16.





## Youths Squad 1999/2000



In 1999/2000 the youths team reached the FAI Youth Cup final for the first time in it's history but lost to Cork City. The team was managed by Martin Coleman and the squad included Eoin Costello, Ted O'Connor, Ian Kilroy, Shane Fogarty, Richie Ryan, Derek Breen, Donal Duggan, Shane Donnelly, Paul Breen, Derek Loughnane, Lorcan Kelly, Trevor Downey, PJ Moloney, Kevin Fogarty, Conor Walsh, Paraic Fogarty (captain), Martin Darmody, Eoin Maher, David Horan.

They also claimed the TSDL Youth Double by winning the Youth Cup and Youth Division 1 League.

In 2000/2001 the squad had better luck in the Munster Youths Cup and beat Douglas of Cork in the final. This was an historic first win for Peake Villa in the Munster Youth Cup competition.

The Junior team, won another double in the T.S.D.L. by claiming the Junior Challenge Cup and the Premier Division League titles.

In 2000/2001 the Youth squad followed up with another win in the Munster Youths Cup and beat Douglas of Cork again in the final. The Youths team again qualified for the FAI Youths Cup final but lost to Bohemians.

They also claimed the TSDL Youth Double for

the second year running by winning the Youth Cup and Youth Division 1 League.

In 2001/02 the Youth team narrowly missed out on the double for the third year in a row. They claimed the TSDL Youth Cup and were runners-up in the Youth Division 1 League.

In 2002/03 Season the Junior A team lost 2-0 to Pike Rovers from Limerick in the Munster Junior Cup Final. The squad was Jim McDonnell, Shane Fogarty, Ian Barnes, David Horan, Alan Leahy, PJ Mooney, Ted O'Connor, Donal Duggan, Paul Kirwan, Padraic Fogarty, Michael Ryan, Barry Ryan, Gavin Morrissey, Eddie O'Brien.

The Youth team won the T.S.D.L. Youth cup for the fourth year in a row and also completed the T.S.D.L. Youth Double by winning the Youth Division 1 League.

In 2005/06 the Junior A team were runners-up in the T.S.D.L. Junior Cup.

In 2006/07 the Junior B team, were runners up in the T.S.D.L. Junior Division 4 shield.

In 2008/09 the Junior A team were T.S.D.L. Premier Division runners-up. The Junior B team, were runners up in the T.S.D.L. Junior Division 4 shield.

The schoolboys u13 won the T.S.S.D.L. Shield Cup and the u12 were the League and

Cup runners-up.

In 2009/10 the Junior A Team were winners of the T.S.D.L. Premier Division and were runner-up in the Peter O'Reilly Cup.

The Youths team were runners-up in the T.S.D.L. Youths Cup.

The schoolboys u13 won the T.S.S.D.L. League and Cup Double.

In 2010/11 the Youths team were T.S.D.L. Youths Division 2 runners-up.

The schoolboys u15 were runners up in the T.S.S.D.L. cup and the u14 won the League.

In 2011/12 the Junior B team were winners of







the T.S.D.L. Junior (B) Peter O'Reilly Cup and the Youths team were again T.S.D.L. Division 2 runners-up and winners of the Youth Division 2 Cup.

In 2011/12 the club decided to take two teams to England to play in the Boys u17 and u16 International Keele Cup competition taking place in Manchester.

We returned with the Boys u17 and Boys u16 Plate Cups, which was a very successful trip.

In 2012/13 the Junior A team won the T.S.D.L. Junior Challenge Cup. The Youth team won the T.S.D.L. Youth Cup, the

Youth Division 2 Cup and won promotion to the Youth Division 1 by winning the T.S.D.L. Division 2 League.

In Sep 2012 Peake Villa started their schoolgirls section and entered teams at u12, u14 and u16.

The u16 Girls won the Cup in their first season.

In 2013/14 the Youth team again won the T.S.D.L. Youth Cup and claimed the Youth Double by capturing the Youth Division 1 League.

The schoolgirls u16 retained their T.S.S.D.L. Cup trophy.

In 2014/15 the Junior A team won the T.S.D.L. Peter O'Reilly Cup.

The Youth team were runners up in the T.S.D.L. Youth Cup and captured the T.S.D.L. Youth Division 1 League for the second year in a row. They also won the Joe Delaney Youth Cup which is the competition shared by the winners of the North and South Tipperary soccer leagues.

The schoolboys u12 were T.S.S.D.L. premier league winners.

The schoolgirls u16 retained their cup trophy for the third year in a row.

In 2015/16 season the schoolboys u15 were runners-up in the T.S.S.D.L. Premier Cup, the u14's won the Premier Cup, the u13A's were runners-up in the Premier Cup, the u13B's were League runners-up, the u12's were runners-up in the Premier Cup and the Premier League.

In 2016/17 the Junior B team completed the T.S.D.L. league and cup double by claiming the Junior B Division 3 Cup and the Junior B Division 3 league.

This means the Junior B team will be playing in the Division 2 league in the 2017/2018 season.

The Junior A squad finished 4th in the T.S.D.L. Premier league and gave the club a number of great days with a fine run in the FAI Junior Cup, loosing to the eventual winners Sherriff Street 2-1 in the quarter-final.

The schoolboys u16 were T.S.S.D.L. Premier Cup runners-up, the u15 were the Cup winners, the u12A were the Premier Cup runners-up.

The schoolgirls u16 were runners up in the league, the u12 were crowned Premier Cup winners and finished League runners-up.
