### SKB Academy Cup

As we expected there has been great interest in the 2019 SKB Academy Cup with the return of Celtic FC.

Celtic are one of the very few clubs that hold a special place in the hearts of most Irish people so naturally we have had many requests regarding fixtures and their opponents.

This year we have changed the format from Under 13 to Under 14 due in no small way to our Under 13 team taking part in the Airtricity League.

So there are a number of players that will take part in the Tournament for the second time and indeed the third time (*welcome back Ben Cisse & Tobias Hurlock of West Brom for their third visit*).

Last year our Under 13 team went on to face Barcelona in the final but finished runners up. With that experience behind them we think they may go one further this year and lift the coveted trophy.

They will have their work cut out for them as their pathway sees them face Watford FC, who are making their debut in the Tournament, in the opening fixture at 10.00am on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> April. Since Ryan Cassidy joined Watford two years ago and proved to be a huge success at Under 18 and Under 23 level, Watford have been keen to come and pit their academy players against us. The following morning at the same time the Saints come up against top German side Bayer Leverkusen. The Saints faced Leverkusen in their opening game last year where they suffered a 1-0 defeat so we will be looking to record a victory over the German team this time around.

In the other group our good friends, West Brom face Celtic in their opening fixture at 11.30am on the Friday morning. Celtic won the Academy Cup back in 2013 so they will be looking to get their name on the trophy for a second time. Meanwhile West Brom will be looking to make a greater impact on the tournament than in previous years.

The other team competing for the trophy this year are Spanish club, Athletico Bilbao who had been requesting an invitation for some time having met our teams at tournaments in Spain over the last number of year.

As ever the quality of football on display will be of the highest calibre and with the change in age we are expecting it to be a bit more intense.

The Tournament runs for three days over the Easter period with four games on both the Friday and Saturday (two in the morning and two in the late afternoon) and three games including the Academy Cup final on the Sunday.

We would remind everyone that entry to the games is  $\notin$ 5 for adults to each block of double games and  $\notin$ 2 for children under 16.

Entrance is through the gate on Shanowen Road. We would also remind drivers to park responsibly – please don't cause obstructions!

## SKB/Bohs Teams on Track

The FAI Airtricity Leagues for our Under 17s, Under 15s and for the first season the Under 13s are up and running with the three teams showing good starts.

The Under 17s have won three and lost one game in their league while the Under 15s having lost their opening game have gone on to win their next two games scoring 10 goals in the process.



Our Under 13 SKB/Bohs team (pictured above) also lost their opening game but the following week they overcame Dundalk with a 5-0 scoreline.

So we were expecting more of the same when they faced Klub Kildare in St Aidans.

But a very slow start saw them a goal down after just 4 minutes when a corner was met at the back post by the opposition centre half.

Throughout the first half the Saints failed to get any rhythm going with their passing failing to find players and their play generally slow. The coaching staff on the sideline were getting frustrated so I reminded them that things would change as the players were good enough. I should go into TV as I had no sooner said it than they did change!

With five minutes left in the half a terrific move saw Aaron Coyle play a ball into Michael Cherico who had been one of the Saints best players throughout the half. He delivered a lovely pass into the path of Nikson Okosun who drove into the area and coolly slotted the ball past the advancing keeper. A few minutes later and the Saints were 2-1 ahead as Cherico met a cross from the right and headed it into the path of Coyle who tucked it away from close range.

The Saints were much better in the second half and created a number of chances. Scott Brady and Darragh Harrison pulled the strings in the middle of the pitch and constantly played important passes to the forwards. It was Harrison who was instrumental in the third Saints goal as he played a top drawer pass into the path of Okosun who again showed great composure to score.

With time running our Kildare grabbed a second goal following a rare misunderstanding in the Saints defence.

But there was no time for a dramatic comeback and despite a lacklustre display SKB/Bohs recorded their second win of the campaign.
