Seniors Book a Place in 2020 FAI Senior Cup



Our Senior team booked a place in next season's FAI Cup preliminary rounds following a victory over Everton FC in the FAI Intermediate Cup recently.

This is a real positive step for both our senior team and St Kevins Boys in the world of Irish football. The last time the Saints were involved in the FAI Senior Cup was back in 2002 (how can we ever forget that great trip to Derry).

The team were promoted from the LSL Major Sunday league this season to the Senior 1B Intermediate Division of the Leinster Senior League and have managed to prove to everyone that they are well capable of challenging at this higher level.

They have progressed as a team to sit second in the table following a very positive start.

The real test was going to be the Intermediate Cup where the top amateur teams in the country get to compete. Following a terrific 3-1 away win over Inchicore Athletic in the last round of the cup they were drawn, at home to face Everton FC of Cork who are no strangers to this competition.

A big crowd turned out to see how the Saints would fare against this side and saw them start on the front foot and take the game to the opposition

Throughout the first half the Saints passed the ball quickly looking to get the wide players running at the Everton defence while our own defence worked hard to cut out any danger that the opposition created

The Everton defence proved to be a tough element to break down and chances were few and far between throughout the first half an hour

But the Saints hit their stride as Luke Ingram narrowly missed opening the scoring with a superb header. Two minutes later and Ingram got on the end of a loose ball in the area and swivelled to drive it home to see them 1-0 ahead at the break.

Everton knew they were still in the game as the referee blew to start the second half. But any game plan that they had conceived went out the window within 15 seconds as Josh Peyton got on the end of Jordan Cromwell's cross and added a second from inside the box.

The opposition were shell shocked but picked themselves up quickly and only for a terrific save from Gavin Browne in goal could have got themselves back in the reckoning.

The goal of the game had to go to Josh Peyton on 30 minutes. A

lovely bit of footwork from Eden Burke on the edge of the area saw him feed the ball to Peyton who produced a stunning strike that hit the top corner.

3-0 to the Saints and Everton knew that there was no way back. Despite that they continued to battle away and as the Saints made changes they managed to grab a goal back with a shot at the back post following a corner.

It left the last ten minutes of the game wide open as Everton threw everything at the Saints and they looked to counter.

In the end time ran out and the final whistle saw the Saints win 3-1, progress to the next round of the cup and earn themselves a place in next year's FAI Cup.

Following the game both teams retired to the Comet for food and refreshments and suffice to say the opposition were full of praise for our lads and wished them all the best in the next round.

It would be a long drive back to Cork but their players decided to bring a drink or two with them to numb the journey!

Little Saints News



Our Little Saints Coaching Academy has been part of St Kevins Boys for nearly 40 years and in that time has seen many changes with the way the Academy is run. Over the last while we have been taking a close look at the current format, something that has served us well for many years, with a view to improving the overall structure.

In the last number of weeks we have had all the players from the Junior section arrive together for the early session and spilt them into groups. Once into their groups the coaches have developed a number of drills on specific coaching points. For instance the simple drill of passing the ball is developed in the session by using three different drills that cement the exercise.

We have also done the same for the Senior section players. Again they all arrive at the same time and split into groups. The idea of splitting them into groups is to encourage players of similar ability to develop at the same pace. We have always said that players develop at different stages so it is important to ensure that they are given the space and time to do exactly that.

One of the other reasons that we have changed the format is to familiarise the players with what to expect as they progress on to our Small Sided Games teams.

This area has changed enormously over the last five years and we feel the current format will better prepare the players to adapt to those changes quicker in years to come.

We are very fortunate to have so many young coaches willing to give up their time on a Saturday afternoon to help these young players on their journey. Most people are unaware that a number of these coaches will have been out since early morning developing the team they are involved with before heading to the Little Saints in the Clubhouse. We are also lucky to have some of our younger team players involved in helping out on Saturdays. And again they all do this voluntarily.

The only thing we ask parents to do is make the effort to bring your enthusiastic young player up every week, make sure they have a drink, shinguards and that their laces are tied properly, then step back and allow them to have fun as they learn!

Under 9s Enjoying the Games
